### Self-directed learning:

#### The role of the teacher

# A day in **Montessori**

- **\* Morning arrival:** Children are greeted by their teachers into the classroom.
- \* **Morning circle time:** The class gathers for a short group activity, such as singing prayer, sharing news, or discussing the day's schedule.
- \* **One and half hour work cycle:** Children choose their activities and work independently or in small groups Teachers observe and guide as needed, presenting new lessons when appropriate.
- **\* Snack time:** Children eat together, practicing grace and courtesy as they serve themselves and clean up after their meal.
- \* **Circle time:** The elaborate circle time includes reciting rhymes, discussing the monthly culture theme and giving chance to children to share their opinion on the topic discussed. Circle time nurtures team spirit and inculcates qualities like paying attention, listening to others and waiting for one's turn.
- \* **Outdoor playtime, dance/sports:** (twice a week) Children have time for free play and physical activities in a safe outdoor environment or inside the classroom depending upon the weather.
- \* **Group activities:** Depending on the age group, children may participate in another work cycle, group lessons, writing activities, listening to stories or special projects like craft work or easel painting.
- **\* Noon circle time:** The class reconvenes for a brief discussion before preparing for dismissal.
- **\* Dismissal:** Children say their goodbyes and leave for the day.

- $\star$  Mont o Minimum Age criteria 2.5 years as of May 31st
- \* Mont 1 Minimum Age criteria 3 years as of May 31st
- \* Mont 2 Minimum Age criteria 4 years as of May 31st
- ★ Mont 3 Minimum Age criteria 5 years as of May 31st
